The Banners

Preceding each set of liturgies (except the last) is a banner representing one great end of the church. These may serve as cover art for printed orders of worship and may be reproduced. The banners appear in color on the cover of this publication. A brief description of the symbolism of each banner follows. Note that the dove, representing the community of the Holy Spirit, appears in each banner.

Banner 1

"The proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind"

The book represents the Scriptures. The dove is rising from the Scriptures indicating the source of both the original witness and our present understanding. The same Spirit that inspired the original writers enables us to receive the gospel. The cross behind the book and dove reminds us that the heart of the gospel is Jesus Christ, God with us and for us.

Banner 2

"The shelter, nurture, and spiritual fellowship of the children of God"
Multi-hued hands represent all the children of God. The dove's wings are tipped downward, sheltering the people of God. The triangle of light links the dove to the people.

Banner 3

"The maintenance of divine worship"
The chalice, a reminder of the Trinity, represents the Lord's Supper, and the three drops of water, Baptism in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The dove reminds us that the same Spirit is present in the Sacraments as in the proclamation of the gospel. The

Sacraments enact the gospel. The raised arms signify our response of praise and thanksgiving: our worship of the living God.

Banner 4

"The preservation of the truth"
The banner represents the light of truth shining in the darkness. The dove reminds us that the truth we proclaim to the world is the gospel of Jesus Christ, God with us and for us. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:5).

Banner 5

"The promotion of social righteousness"
The banner represents Amos 5:24: "But
let justice roll down like waters, and
righteousness like an everflowing stream."

Banner 6


"And the exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world"

The dove is in flight over the globe, carrying an olive branch, echoing Gen. 6:11: "And lo, in her mouth a freshly plucked olive leaf; so Noah knew that the waters had subsided from the earth." This represents the eighth day of creation, God's grace coming into the world, the reign of God proclaimed by Jesus Christ. The light rising behind the earth represents the dawning of God's kingdom.

Dear Friends in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.),

As never before, Presbyterians need to find common ground in the gospel of Jesus Christ. I can think of no better way to reclaim that common ground than through an emphasis on "The Great Ends of the Church." They are what unite Presbyterians and set our direction for mission.

The Great Ends of the Church are a real jewel. They were developed in the former United Presbyterian Church of North America as that church faced a new century in the early 1900s. As we begin a new millennium, it is critical that we also reflect on those things that are central to our calling and our life together.

We find The Great Ends of the Church in the first chapter of our *Book of Order* (G–1.0200):

The great ends of the church are the proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind; the shelter, nurture, and spiritual fellowship of the children of God; the maintenance of divine worship; the preservation of the truth; the promotion of social righteousness; and the exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world.

What a wonderful vision. The great ends make it clear that our common calling is an inclusive one. The call to share the gospel is matched by a commitment to social justice. The need for a renewal in worship is matched by a commitment to truth. The imperative of building up the Christian community is matched by a call to exhibit the Kingdom of Heaven to all the world.

The 209th General Assembly (1997) called on Presbyterian churches, governing bodies, and institutions to reshape their lives in line with the great ends of the church. This resource helps us understand this vision more clearly and offers ways for congregations to move toward these great ends.
